# INTRODUCTORY

The author, in compiling this map, has, without favor or partiality, aimed to give a satisfactory illustration of the principal portion of Denver and its improvements. Being the railroad and commercial center of the great Rocky Mountain gold region and Valley of the Platte, also commanding a large portion of the trade of New Mexico and northwestern Territories, it is all important that it should be shown to those interested that this is something more than a "paper Town."

Its inexhaustible coal fields, extensive pine forests, quarries of building stone, lime, and plaster, all within a few miles of the city, by the best natural roads, with material and facilities for manufacturing brick of superior quality within the city limits, extensive water power, and the many different lines of railroads being projected to this point, all combine to make this the great inland city of the Union.

To give a better and more satisfactory description of the beautiful "city of the plains," the author, with permission of the Denver Board of Trade, quotes the following, published in their pamphlet, entitled "Resources of Colorado":

# "ARAPAHOE COUNTY,

adjoining Douglas on the north, holds the city of Denver, the commercial and political metropolis of the Territory. The South Flat's river runs across its western front, affording an abundance of water for irrigating and manufacturing purposes. The population is about seven thousand; and the valuation of taxable property \$4,630,693 in 1867. The 'Platte Water Compenies Canal,' constructed for the purpose of affording water for irrigating the soil, and supplying the city of Denver for manufacturing and domestic purposes, lately completed to that point, a distance of twenty-four miles, at a cast of \$100,000, will irrigate thousands of acres of land in the counties of Douglas and Arapshoe, and is capable of an indefinite extension and measure of usefulness.

# "THE CITY OF DENVER,

is beautifully situated on a plain at the junction of Cherry Creek with the South Platte river, twelve miles from the foot of the mountains, five thousand feet above tide level, and has, at this date, a population of about six thousand souls. Men from the East gaze with astonishment at this compactly-built, busy settlement, with its brick blocks, hotels, elegant residences, churches, and school-houses, with all the reculiarities of a large city, standing on the edge of the 'Great American Desert,' seven hundred miles from the frontier.

"There are six churches, several of them imposing brick structures, belonging to the Episcopal, Methodist, Baptist, Presbyterian, Congregational, and Catholic societies, respectively. The Catholics have one convent, and the Methodists and Episcopalians each large seminary buildings—two free, and several select schools. There are two first-class flouring mills, capable of making several hundred sacks of flour per day, both propelled by water power; two planning mills, sash and door factories, gunsmiths, manufacturers of jewelry, cabinet manufacturers, upholsterers, two large breweries, and one distillery, &c. Coaches leave every day for the termini of the two railroads, and for Santa Fe, and the various mining towns in the mountains.

"The view and scenery from Denver and its vicinity is wonderful and grand; Pike's and Long's Peaks, with over two hundred miles of snow-capped range, are plainly visible, and—seen through the clear mountain atmosphere, with the shadows of the passing clouds lighting and shading in rapid succession and infinite variety their seemed and broken surfaces—present a panorama which beggars description, and is pronounced by all travelers as unequaled elsewhere in the world.

"This scenery, always new and beautiful, looking never twice alike, since it can not be seen twice under the same reflection of cloud and condition of atmosphere, has power to attract again to its contemplation the wanderer, however remote, and so may be said to have an intrinsic value, and claim a place in this publication.

"The following statement of the business of Denver for the year ending the 31st of October, 1867, is compiled from the report of a committee, appointed by the Board of Trade, and is mainly derived from official returns in the Assessor's office. The exhibit represents the least active year in the history of Denver, covering a period of Indian wer, when the main lines of travel east and west were almost closed by Indians, and immigration virtually prohibited:

THE MAP,

is intended to show buildings and improvements of the principal portion of the city; brick, stone, or concrete buildings, shaded redframe or wooden buildings, yellow.

## EAST AND WEST DIVISIONS OF DENVER.

That portion of the city west of Cherry Creek is called the "West Division;" that east of the creek, "East Division." Cherry Creek is spanned by substantial bridges at the corssing of Blake and Larimer streets, besides foot-bridges at Holladay and Lawrence Streets. The Platte river is bridged by good, substantial structures at the extension of F. street, in the East Division, and Larimer and Fifth streets, in the West Division, which can be seen by referring to the samll map, in lower right-hand corner.

The West Division of the city, when first laid out in 1858, was named Aurora. Soon after the town site of "St. Charles," now the Bast Division, was claimed by certain parties, with a view of opposition to Aurora. It was subsequently surveyed and platted by a company, who named it "Denver." In 1859, Ferry was the main business street, having many substantial brick buildings. A largely increased immigration during the summer of 1860 from the East, in search of gold, was induced by the "Denver Iron Company" to settle on the east side of Cherry Creek, and from that time the city has had a steady and permanent increase in population and wealth, the principal business streets being now on the east side.

THE SMALL MAP,

is intended to show the Congressional grant to the city of Denver, consisting of Section No. 33, and the west half of Section No. 34, Township 3 south, Range 68 west, containing nine hundred and sixty (960) acres, as incorporated by an act of the Territorial Legislature, in November, 1861. It also shows the several additions to the original incorporation, which is explained by letters of reference on the map.

# RAILROAD DEPOTS.

shown on this map. The ground, as indicated, was donated to the milroad com any by parties owning the same. The passenger depot is located within four blocks of the "Metropolitan Hotel," corner of G. and Blake streets.

## "COLORADO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY'S" GROUNDS,

containing forty acres, is inclosed by a substantial concrete wall eight feet high. It has a half-mile race track, and a suitable building for holding fairs. The association has spared no expense in making this equal to any Eastern fair ground.

## FORD'S PARK.

Adjoining the agricultural grounds is Ford's Park, containing eighty acres, and, like its neighbor, is surrounded by a high wall, and has a mile track in splendid condition. The association, with enormous expense, have made this one of the finest and most fashionable resorts west of Chicago, having all the necessary accommodations in the way of buildings, stands, shaded drives, &c., &c., to rank among the first-class grounds of the kind in the East.

### THE PLATTE RIVER CANAL

is also shown, which is some twenty-four miles in length, constructed by an organization of Denver capitalists, and intended to furnish the city with water, and irrigate thousands of acres under cultivation It carries abundance of water for power, which will, at no distant day, make Denver the great manufacturing town of the west.

There are two other canals, running water in the west Division (not shown on the map, as no survey was ever made of their couse), taking water from the Platte, some six miles above Denver, which now rum two large flouring mills, and other lighter machinery, and also furnish water for irrigating that part of the city.

# THE CAPITOL OF COLORADO.

By an act of the Legislature of 1867-8, the capitol of Colorado was located at Denver. Town lots have been donated for the location of public buildings, and a "State House" will be erected, whose proportions and architectural designs will be in keeping with the numerour residences and public buildings of the city.

The "incorporate limits" of the city are also shown, as indicated by dotted black line.

# FIRE LIMITS.

Within the "fire limits," indicated by heavy dotted red line, the erection of wooden buildings is prohibited by ordinance of city council, passed October 17, 1867.

This EXPLANATION TO DIAGRAM OF DENVER has been indexed for names of individuals, businesses, organizations, etc., associated with a given building. Cross references and cross indexing should make any item easily located. Personal names in the index may indicate property ownership, business location, or residence; it is not always clear which.

The <u>number</u> indicates the <u>number</u> of the <u>block</u>. Locate this number in the EXPLANATION and then read through to locate the <u>building number</u> for the name or business or institution wanted. Now consult the DIAGRAM (map) to locate the block number and then the building number. This should enable you to determine the information you want.

Many businesses such as "lunch room" or "grocery" are indicated in the EXPLANATION butnot identified by owner or proprietor. These have not been indexed. Careful reading of the EXPLANATION, coupled with close examination of the DIAGRAM, will yield much information. Consulting Wharton's HISTORY OF THE CITY OF DENVER and the index to the ROCKY MOUNTAIN NEWS may also serve to verify uncertain locations.

There are several obvious misspellings of proper names in the EXPLANA-
